

Transportation



Centrally located in the heart of Northwestern Mississippi, Bolivar County offers business and industry the option of transporting and receiving goods by highway, air, and major river port.

Highways including four-lane U.S. 61, 49W, MS 8 and MS 446 traverse the County, connecting the region to major markets to the north, south, east and west. Additionally, I-69 will directly bisect Bolivar County,

providing new access to Canada, the Midwest and Southwest U.S., and to Central America. With I-55 and U.S. 82 also just 40 minutes from Cleveland, the County is within 500 miles or less of a number of major metropolitan areas including, Atlanta, New Orleans, Dallas, Memphis, Nashville, St. Louis and Birmingham.



The Rosedale-Bolivar County Port offers access to the nation's largest and busiest waterway, the Mississippi River. The Port has a "T"-shaped dock with a 150-ton crane with a 5-yard clam bucket, a 20,000 square foot terminal building and outside concrete storage pads with access to rail service.



Cleveland has Bolivar County's largest general aviation airport. For commercial flights, the Mid-Delta Regional Airport in Greenville, just minutes away, is served by Northwest Airlink. The County is also within an easy driving distance of both the Memphis and Jackson International airports.
